Many members of DEEP will know Peter Ashley who sadly died this month.

Peter lived with a diagnosis of dementia with Lewy Bodies for many years and was a tireless campaigner for the rights of people living with all forms of dementia.

Peter supported DEEP and was an influential member of the project advisory group for DEEP for the last three years.

He will be missed by everyone. Thank you Peter.

Our DEEP Celebration Event

On 10th November, representatives from 14 different DEEP groups met in Birmingham to celebrate the last three years of DEEP and to look forward to the next four years.

The groups shared highlights and outcomes of recent work including:

- projects are both local and national as is funding.
- making friends and being with other people who understand is very high in importance.
- other activities the groups are involved in were mentioned such as a choir, reading groups and a new dining out club.
- whilst some groups are very new, others reported celebrating 3rd or 5th anniversaries.
- many groups still need more local support.
- The Irish Dementia Working Group was represented and Chris Roberts reported that he is working with Alzheimer's Society to think about an English and Welsh Working Group.

We also talked about some of the issues for DEEP in the next four years. These include:

- How to support the DEEP network that is growing very quickly?
- Who makes the decisions about what the network does?
- How do we make groups sustainable in terms of funding, membership and staff support?
- How do we increase our influence?

- What areas do we want to focus our campaigning on?
